Group Riding Etiquette – By Lisa Walsh

Have you ever had to stop riding after 45 minutes of riding? Have you ever had a friend pull up on her bike and point to her tank? I'm sure this has happened to us all at one time: "Oh, I forgot to fill my tank!" Most people have gone through this on our own rides, flipping on reserve in that remote location thinking, "Augh, I hope I make it!"

So why am I stating these comments? Two Reasons: First, you need to know where your reserve is and how to flip it while riding. When riding in a group, it's dangerous to swerve while searching for your reserve switch. Second, having to stop 45 minutes into a ride, because you didn't get gas when the rest of the group did, isn't fair to everyone else.

In a group ride, we function as one "team". We all have individual desires and needs; however, these need to be set aside otherwise we would never successfully complete a ride.

I, as well as the "group" thank you in advance for being considerate of each other by filling up your bike when the group stops and fills tanks. You ride your own ride, but within a group be considerate of everyone!

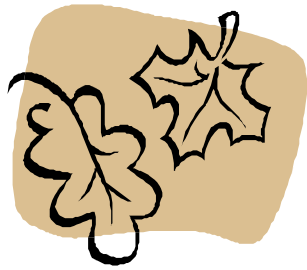
